

Sawatzky romps in 46-11 win

It was the Tyson Sawatzky show in high school football on Friday in Saskatoon as he helped lead his Marion Graham Falcons to a convincing 46-11 victory over the North Battleford Vikings.

Sawatzky scored early and often as his 77 yard touchdown reception from Joe Devine opened the scoring in the first quarter.

The six-foot-one senior added a 24 yard touchdown catch from Devine as well as a 57 yard touchdown run. And when he wasn't on offence, he was still scoring, as his 75 yard punt return electrified the special teams unit.

Although Sawatzky didn't score on defence, teammate Keegan Harrison-Pollock found a way as he returned a fumble 65 yards for a touchdown.

Devine also added a one-yard touchdown run while Carter Tomyn kicked a 28-yard field goal, a single on a missed field goal and converted all six touchdowns.

The lone Vikings touchdown was scored by Cole Tenetuik on a one yard run. Dylan Chadwick added a field goal and converted the touchdown.

The Falcons improve to 2-1 on the season while the Vikings fall to 0-2.

In other high school action out of Prince Albert, Kyle Siemens's six touchdown passes led the Aden Bowman Bears to a 50-2 mauling of Prince Albert Carlton.

Tyler Hurlburt hauled in a 30 yard touchdown pass and Kenton Vinding a 55 yarder in the first quarter. In the second quarter it was Parker Baumgartner's turn on a 17 yarder as well as Cam Kelly's 26-yard reception and Preston Njaa's 20 yard touchdown.

Baumgartner added a 10-yard touchdown in the third quarter.

Ryan Lasante had two field goals for the Bears and converted all six touchdowns. The Bears added a safety touch.

Carlton opened the scoring on a single and rounded it out with a single on a Kelvin Howard missed field goal attempt but that was all the offence they could generate.

The Bears lead 4A high school football with a perfect 5-0 record and have outscored their opponents by a 173-20 margin. Prince Albert Carlton is in a tie for third place at 3-1.

In late action it was the Walter Murray Marauders shutting out the Bethlehem Stars 44-0. The game featured two kickoff return touchdowns courtesy of Karim Safi with an 88 yarder, and Chris Fryatt-Miller of 81 yards.
